

Energy Management Obligations in 2014

In 2014 NORA met it's Public Body Energy Management obligations under S.I. 542 2009 <u>S.I. No. 542/2009 - European Communities (Energy End-use</u> <u>Efficiency and Energy Services) Regulations 2009</u>

NORA continues to persue it's energy saving targets for 2020 through participation in SEAI's system for Energy Monitoring and Reporting for the Public Sector.

Overview of Energy Usage in 2014

The main energy use by the National Oil Reserves Agency in 2014 was at

- NORA's office building at 7 Clanwilliam Square,
- NORA's oil storage terminal at Ringsend Dublin,
- NORA's oil storage terminal at Tarbert, Co. Kerry.

In 2014 at NORA's office building 21.167 MWh were consumed at a carbon emission total of 10,450 kgs.

At the NORA terminal in Ringsend, 23.3 MWh were consumed at a carbon emission of 11,503 kgs.

In the NORA terminal in Tarbert 64.7 MWh were consumed with a carbon emission of 31,942 kgs.
