Energy Management Obligations in 2017

In 2017 NORA met its Public Body Energy Management obligations set out in S.I. No. 542/2009 - European Communities (Energy End-use Efficiency and Energy Services) Regulations 2009

NORA continues to pursue its energy saving targets for 2020 through participation in SEAI's system for Energy Monitoring and Reporting.

Overview of Energy Usage in 2017

NORA's main energy use in 2017 was as follows:

NORA's office building – 19.6 MWh were consumed at a carbon emission total of 8,622 kg.

Ringsend terminal -16.1 MWh were consumed at a carbon emission of 7,064 kg.

Tarbert terminal -64.1 MWh were consumed with a total carbon emissions of 28,192 kg.

Energy Management Actions in 2017

- Ongoing commitment to SEAI energy M&R programme.
- Commitment to the practical, technical and behavioural adjustments necessary to achieve energy savings.
- Continued implementation of NORA's Energy Management Plan.
- Appointment of a contractor to install a 10kW solar energy generator at the Tarbert terminal to reduce net energy consumption and to cut CO₂ emissions.
