

Energy Management Obligations in 2016

In 2016 NORA met its Public Body Energy Management obligations under S.I. 542 2009 [S.I. No. 542/2009 - European Communities \(Energy End-use Efficiency and Energy Services\) Regulations 2009](#)

NORA continues to pursue its energy saving targets for 2020 through participation in SEAI's system for Energy Monitoring and Reporting.

Overview of Energy Usage in 2016

The main energy (i.e. electricity) use by the National Oil Reserves Agency in 2016 was at

NORA's office building at Clanwilliam Square - 22.3 MWh were consumed at a carbon emission total of 11,099 kgs.

Ringsend terminal - 20.8 MWh were consumed at a carbon emission of 10,333 kgs.

Tarbert terminal - 70.1 MWh were consumed with a total carbon emissions of 34,824 kgs.

Energy Management Actions in 2016

- Ongoing commitment to SEAI energy M&R program.
- Commitment to the practical, technical and behavioural adjustments necessary to achieve energy savings.
- Continued implementation of NORA's Energy Management Plan.
- At Tarbert, following completion of a feasibility study commissioned at the end of 2015, a process has begun to appoint a project team to install a small-scale solar energy power plant to reduce net energy consumption and to cut CO₂ emissions.
