

### **Energy Management Obligations in 2015**

In 2015 NORA met its Public Body Energy Management obligations under S.I. 542 2009 [S.I. No. 542/2009 - European Communities \(Energy End-use Efficiency and Energy Services\) Regulations 2009](#)

NORA continues to pursue its energy saving targets for 2020 through participation in SEAI's system for Energy Monitoring and Reporting.

### **Overview of Energy Usage in 2015**

The main energy use by the National Oil Reserves Agency in 2015 was at

NORA's office building - 22.5 MWh were consumed at a carbon emission total of 11,086 kgs.

Ringsend terminal - 19.0 MWh were consumed at a carbon emission of 9,380 kgs.

Tarbert terminal - 61.2 MWh were consumed with a total carbon emissions of 30,189 kgs.

### **Energy Management Actions in 2015**

- Commitment to SEAI energy M&R program.
- Commitment to the practical, technical and behavioural adjustments necessary to achieve energy savings.
- Continued implementation of the Energy Management Plan.
- At Tarbert, a feasibility study was commissioned at the end of 2015 to determine if there was a potential to reduce energy consumption through engineering measures relating to the main energy consuming activity - the heating of fire-pumps' starting mechanism. The outcome of the study is expected in early 2016.
